What have we got listed on our action plan?

Eco-Schools Topic 1

Healthy Living

Aim:

Encourages children, and the whole community to take responsible health-related choices and actions

that protect the environment.

Eco-Schools Topic 2

Transport

Aim:

Create ways for children, staff and local community to work together to raise awareness of transport issues and come up with practical solutions that will make a real difference to the community's everyday lives.

Eco-Schools Topic 3

Litter

Aim:

Research the impact of litter on the environment and explores practical means for reducing and minimising the amount of litter produced by the school and in the local area of Harden.

Action(s):

Each class grow its own fruit, vegetables, or herbs (EYFS develop a sensory garden)

Start an eco-newsletter with hints and tips include tasty and healthy recipe ideas (including plant-based recipes)

Have a suggestion box, so they can address environmental concerns and combat ecoanxiety

Action(s):

A walk to school week or any other similar campaign

Survey the staffroom, do more than half of staff members walk, cycle, use public transport or car share to travel to school

How long will it take?

Summer 1 – suggestion box Summer 2 - Eco newsletter Autumn - develop growing own veg

Who is responsible?

Suggestion box and Eco newsletter - Year 5 and 6 members. Develop growing own veg- whole committee

How long will it take?

Summer 1 - Survey teachers Summer 2 - Walk to school week

Who is responsible?

Survey teachers - Year 2, 3, 5 members Walk to school week - whole committee

Action(s):

Participate on Keep Britain Tidy's Great Big School Clean

Invite members of the school community (e.g., families, businesses, nearby schools, council members etc.) to participate in a litterpick organised by the committee

Written to head teacher/ local council/ MP/ pupil's families/ nearby businesses about litter-related issues

How long will it take?

Summer 2 - Write letters Autumn 2022 – Invite community to litter picks Spring 2023 -

Who is responsible?

Write letters - Year 4 and 5 members Invite community to litter picks – all members

Featured Plant Based Recipe by Noah and Poppy in Year 5 Vegan pancakes -

Ingredients
Flour 1 cup
Almond milk 1 cup
Sugar 2tbsp
Apple cider vinegar
1tbsp
Baking powder 1tbsp
Vanilla 1tsp
Salt ½ tsp

1. In a medium bowl, add the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Then stir to combine.

action.

- 2. In a medium bowl or liquid measuring cup, add almond milk, apple cider vinegar, and vanilla,. Then stir to combine.
- 3. Pour the liquid mixture into the dry mixture and whisk until smooth.
- 4. Let batter rest for 5 minutes.
- 5. Pour about ½ cup (65 grams) of batter onto a nonstick pan or griddle over medium heat.
- 6. When the top begins to bubble, flip the pancake and cook until golden.
- 7. Serve warm with maple syrup. Enjoy!
