The National Curriculum in Year 1.

- English and Maths is taught everyday.
- Science is a core subject

- Art/DT topics alternate each half term
- Phonics is taught daily and discreetly and supported in the majority of lessons.
- We link lessons together to gain a cross curricular approach.
- Phonics Screening at the end of year 1.



English



Suggestions for home

- Encourage children to write in pencil.
- Encourage children to re read what they have written to you.
- Ask children to help with daily jobs e.g shopping lists/reminders/writing a letter to family members.
- Use phonics to spell.
- Encourage use of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
- Practice letter formation.
- Look for the digraphs/trigraphs when struggling to read a word.

<u>Maths</u>



Suggestions for home

- Encourage number hunts where ever you are.
- Number formation- facing the right way, 2-digit numbers in the right order.
- Make it fun- use food e.g how many sausages are you having for tea? Sharing sweets/grapes out for a teddy bear's picnic.
- Counting (forwards and backwards) and 2s 5s and 10s
- One more and one less language.

Reading



- Read every night/other night.
- Reading journals updated at home and in school.
- Build it up/don't put pressure on them (couple of pages per night)
- Tricky words
- Take turns reading sentences in book.
- Read books to them.

Science in Year 1



We cover: <u>Plants</u>, <u>Animals including humans</u>, <u>Everyday Materials</u> and <u>Seasonal Changes</u>.

What is phonics?



•Children are taught to read by breaking down words into separate sounds or 'phonemes'. They are then taught how to blend these sounds together to read the whole word.

•Children have a 30 minutes phonics lesson each day and they are encouraged to use these strategies to read and write in other lessons.



•This year the children will begin to learn the different ways the same sound can be represented.

What will the children be expected to do?


•The check is very similar to tasks the children already complete during phonics lessons.

•Children will be asked to 'sound out' a word and blend the sounds together, e.g. d-o-g - dog d o q

•The focus of the check is to see which sounds the children know and therefore the children will be asked to read made up 'nonsense' words or 'alien words' as we like to call them.

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How can you help?

•When reading with children, encourage them to put the sounds buttons under a word to highlight the sounds that make the word.

•Encourage the children when they are writing to use their phonics to spell a word rather than spelling it out for them.

•Read regularly at home.

•"Chunk" long words so that children can still read the word independently.

•Make it fun! Pretending you can't do it and getting them to teach you is usually a good trick.
