Curriculum and Age Related Expectations



English



- Use capital letters and full stops consistently.
- Use co-ordinating conjunctions and, but, or.
- Use subordinating conjunctions because, if, that, when.
- Use commas, question, exclamation and speech marks.
- Start sentences in different ways.
- Organise writing to suite its purpose.
- Some use of ambitious words. ('wow words.')
- Correct spelling of high frequency words.
- Independent application of phase 5 words.
- Check own writing and develop.
- Write in sections/ paragraph.
- Develop stamina for writing.

Suggestions for home



- Encourage children to write in pencil.
- Encourage children to re-read what they have written to you.
- Ask children to help with daily jobs e.g shopping lists/reminders/writing a letter to family members.
- Use phonics to spell.
- Reinforce use of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops.
- Practice letter formation.

Reading



- Books Lower level to practise fluency and for enjoyment, Levelled book to practise and develop reading skills.
- Read with fluency a range of age-appropriate text types from those specified for YRs 1 and 2 (which may include fairy stories, myths and legends, poetry, plays and non-fiction books).
- Read at a speed sufficient for them to focus on understanding.
- Read most common exception words by sight, (including all those in the YR 1 spelling appendix) noting unusual correspondence between spelling and sound.
- Use phonic skills consistently and automatically to address unfamiliar or challenging words.
- Determine the meaning of new words by sometimes applying knowledge of root words Prepare poems and play scripts to read aloud and perform.
- Show appropriate volume when reciting or reading aloud.

Suggestions for home



- Read every night/other night.
- Aim for about 10 mins per session.
- Read books to them.
- Discuss what they have read and ask questions to show understanding.
- Talk about unfamiliar vocabulary.
- Encourage expression especially after developing fluency.

- Fractions 1/3, $\frac{1}{4}$, 2/4, $\frac{3}{4}$.

- Number formation- facing the right way, 2digit numbers in the right order.

- Throughout school we are still focusing on handwriting and presentation.
- Handwriting
 - Precursive/cursive writing.
 - Helps with spelling.
 - Writing should flow.

- Presentation
 - They need to take care and present their work neatly.
 - The children need to be proud of what they have done.

Phonics/ Spelling



- Continued practise of phonics phases from year
 1 for children who need it. (Little Wandel linking to the reading groups)
- Continued practise of high frequency and common exception words.
- Spelling lessons 3 sessions a week
- Spelling patterns.
- Spelling Check Mondays.
- New spellings Tuesday via MM.
- Look for words spelt correctly in their writing.
