Reception Update

This half term Reception have really enjoyed their topic "Amazing Animals". The children have loved exploring animals found in our world and finding out about them including: what they eat, where they live and how they survive. The children have learnt about Nocturnal and Diurnal animals, animals that hibernate and animals that live in the different zones of the ocean including: sunlight, twilight and midnight

light and midnight.









Reception have also been thinking of how we can care and protect the animals in our world. The children learnt about looking after pets by providing them with food, water, love and care but also how we can help wild animals through picking up litter and caring for our world. The children were really invested in litter picking with some children choosing to litter pick in the playground at lunchtime!

Finally, Reception had a visit to Tropical World where we explored different habitats found in our world. The children really enjoyed learning about animals found in the Rainforest, woodlands and the Desert during the workshop in the morning and used their prior knowledge of animals to support new learning. Reception then spent the afternoon exploring Tropical World and observing their animals the meerkats were definitely a favourite! The children's behaviour was outstanding and we had a great time.







Year One Update

This half term year 1 have been learning all about how fire fighting has changed through time. They started the term with a commando Joe's session where the children had to work out how to collect water from the river Thames to put the fire of London out. Since then they have been busy using historical sources to help them to learn about life in 1666 and compared fire fighting then to now.









In computing this half term the children have been learning how to create animated books. They created backgrounds, added characters and sounds and retold the story of the Fire of London.









On Spanish day the children had lots of fun learning how to flamenco dance, creating Spanish flags and learning to introduce _____them-









selves and name the months of the year. They also enjoyed trying some Spanish tortillas and had a Spanish lesson from Year 3 who taught them how to count to 10.

In Art, the children have enjoyed learning about Claude Monet as an artist and exploring pieces of his art work. The children developed their painting skills to create their own picture of The Great Fire of London. They explored using poster paint and powder paint and mixed primary colours to create secondary colours.









Year Two Update

Over the past few weeks, Year Two have been busy learning all about The Arctic, looking at the environment, wildlife and everyday lives of the Inuit people. They researched Arctic animals and found out about the adaptations the animals have to help them survive in the harsh conditions. Then, they compared life in Harden to life in the Arctic and decided that Harden was an easier and safer place to live.



Year 2 have had fun learning 'The Grandma Rap' in music, where they have learnt the words, actions and have sung in rounds.

In Science, they have continued their work on Materials and have been carrying out fair tests, discussing how we carry out a fair test by only changing one variable. Year 2 tested which material was waterproof and which materials make good insulators. They wrote predictions, collected results and wrote conclusions.





During DT, Year 2 have been designing puppets and then choosing materials to make their puppets using sewing techniques. They have written their own puppet show to share with children in Reception.



Year 3 Update

Terrific Tudors!

Year 3 have been learning all about life in the Tudor era. This topic spans across history, English and DT. In English they have been writing a historical story in 1st person, and have been building Tudor houses in DT. Year 3 have been able to deepen their Tudor learning through the use of history and drama during the 'Terrifying Tudors' workshop. They acted as King Henry VIII, the Tudor court, and his six wives, acting out the story of how Henry ruled over Tudor England. This tested their historical knowledge of the Tudors and their acting skills. The workshop provided a first person experience of being a Tudor!

World Book Day

Year 3 focused on the class author Dick King-Smith, creating book covers and posters about his books. They enjoyed the day and looked amazing in their costumes! Science

Year 3 have set up and been tracking an ongoing experiment surrounding the conditions that plants need to grow. They have planted 'control' seeds and seeds that have had a key condition removed, for example there is one in the dark. Each week they have been measuring them to track the growth.

Spanish

On Spanish day Year 3 completed further learning promoting our amazing Spanish curriculum. They completed maths in Spanish, learnt a flamenco sequence and much more!







Year 4 Update

This half term Year 4 we have been focussing on Sound. We started the half term with a fantastic day out at Magna Science Museum. We took part in a sound workshop and explored how sounds are made and how we can change the pitch and volume of different sounds. We then explored the different areas of the museum: Air, Water, Earth and Fire. We had an amazing time and learnt lots!







We learnt about how we hear sounds, what pitch is and how sound travels. We planned and carried out an investigation to explore how distance affects sound.

Our music has linked nicely across the curriculum this half term as we have been exploring the Colour of Sound. We have been looking at different colours and composing pieces of music in groups to represent different colours. We thought about pitch, volume and which instruments would suit the different colours. We really enjoyed performing our pieces to the class.



In Art we have been working with watercolours and learning how we can use different techniques to create different textures. We explored: wet on wet, wet on dry and blending using water colour paint. We then used our techniques to paint beautiful pictures for our Mother's Day cards. We hope you liked them!









In Geography, we have been intrigued with our Mapping unit. We have learnt where West Yorkshire is and used our enquiry based learning approach to gain knowledge on a specific area. We found out what types of human and physical features there are in our chosen area and explored Digimaps to learn about the symbols identifying features too.

Year 5 Update

For their Global Goals Topic Day, Year 5 focused on the goal of ensuring that all people have clean water and sanitation systems. Throughout the day, the children looked at ways to save water as well as how we get clean and safe water. They conducted an investigation, filtering 'raw sewage', showing how water can be filtered to make it safer. They also looked at case studies of people who did not have access to clean water and sanitation systems and applied their learning

while designing a solution for them.







In History, Year 5 have been learning, about Victorian life in Saltaire. To 'hook' them into this topic, a Victorian visitor came in and told the children about life in Saltaire 200 years ago. The children have since looked at Saltaire's history and what life would have been like for different people in the town. They then had the opportunity to bring their learning to life on their

visit to Saltaire, where they could see how it has changed from then to now.





In Computing, Year 5 have been learning about using digital concept maps. They began their unit creating a 'web' of ideas which showed them how different ideas

and concepts are connected. Across the weeks, the children then developed their understanding of using concept maps, working on collaborative documents and using 'presentation mode' to share their well organised sequences of ideas.






Year 6 Update

The children explored gender equality during the Global Goals topic week; they explored the history of gender equality and then challenged some of these thoughts through a selection of activities.










In PE, the children have developed their Yoga skills. First, they developed their flexibility through learning the sun salutation flow and then created their own flow adapting these poses. Following this, they



worked collaboratively to develop their own flow after learning several more poses. During Yoga, they have developed their control, balance and technique producing some impressive results.
